RESOLUTION # 1-18-95 J

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Van De Bruggen
- WHEREAS, the Tax Parcel No: 17-0-0574/0575/0581/0605/0610/0612/0627/0628 0629/0630/0631/0635/0637/0638/0639/0640/0641/0642/0645
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:  
Lot One (1) of Certified Survey Map No. 2052 filed in the Office of the Register of Deeds for Outagamie County, Wisconsin in Volume 11 of Certified Survey Maps on page 2052 as Document No. 1138571, being all of the East ½ of the Northeast ¼; all of Government Lot 1; part of Government Lots 21 and 22; and part of the Northeast ¼ of the Southeast ¼, all in Section 31; all Government Lots 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 24, 25, 26, and 27; part of Government Lots 23 and 28; the Northwest ¼ of the Northwest ¼; and part of the Southwest ¼ of the Southwest ¼ all in Section 32, Township 24 North, Range 19 East, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and




Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.
