Because of the heroism of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the Oneida nation and the Colonists of Pennsylvania, a national status was made possible.

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has obtained a loan of \$90,000.00 under Loan Contract No. F50C14200907 to purchase the Levi Doxtator estate, and,

WHEREAS, a general assignment, Exhibit H, is required or listed in Area Office letter of May 22, 1975,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribal Business Committee hereby approves the execution of Exhibit H and hereby authorizes the Chairman and Secretary of the Oneida Tribal Business Committee to sign such document.
