RESOLUTION NO. 3-19-79-C

- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Highway Safety Program, is negotiating a Memorandum of Agreement with Indian Health Service headquarters to set in place a first responder Emergency Medical Service (EMS) system in Indian communities, and
- WHEREAS, this program would provide for the training and equipping of first responders with two-way radios and medical supply kits,
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc has a need for Emergency Medical Services, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe has great interest in strengthening health services on the Reservation.
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we request Indian Health Service headquarters to include the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. in the development of a first responder EMS Program in furtherance of the EMS Component of the Highway Safety Act.
