## RESOLUTION NO. 3-24-82-K

WHEREAS The Oneida Tribe wishes to strengthen the Oneida Family, and

WHEREAS The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin wishes to accomplish this through the establishment of a Comprehensive Social Services System, and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin request to contract and administer a Comprehensive Social Services System from BIA funded funds and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That contract negotiations amendments and/or modifications be initiated through the Health Director and Tribal Administrator who will seek final approval of the Oneida Business Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Bureau of Indian Affairs take whatever action is necessary to assist the Oneida Tribe in its program funding needs and that the proposal project be included on Oneida's band analysis.

### C E R T I F I C A T I O N
