RESOLUTION NO. 3-31-83-B

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians has made a strong commitment to providing its Senior Citizens with adequate health services, nutritional services, social services and recreational services; and

WHEREAS, The commitment to providing these services continues to be a high priority of the Oneida Tribal Comprehensive Plan for community development; and


WHEREAS, The existing services center facility for Senior Citizens of the Oneida Community is in serious need of expansion;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Oneida Tribe of Indians commit the amount of \$116,750.00 from the Oneida Tribal General Fund to be used as a matching share contribution to be combined with a \$116,733.00 grant from the Community Development Block Grant Proposal for the expansion of the existing Oneida Senior Citizens Center.
