RESOLUTION 4-16-79-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. recently invested various Tribal resources in a 60-acre farm known as Iroquois Farms; and,

WHEREAS, such farm and other lands are aspirations to Oneida Tribal self-sufficiency; and,

WHEREAS, Tribal resources are presently insufficient to develop and expand the current Tribal farm operations in accordance with generally accepted objectives and traditional values; and,

WHEREAS, Iroquois Farms has developed a realistic, basic operational budget for a six-month duration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Business Committee hereby approves the pursuance of any/all funds by Iroquois Farms through grants, contracts, gifts or exchanges or any other beneficial resources.
