RESOLUTION NO. 74-4-17

WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a political entity; striving to align itself with the Presidents' policy of self determination, and

WHEREAS the current voting structure of Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council, Inc. does not afford egalitarian representation, and

WHEREAS H.E.W./O.N.A.P. in its "Transmittal of Recommendations Developed at Conferences", dated March 1, 1974, page 1, paragraph 3, states "The Office of Native American Programs should advocate that all Federal offices fund Tribes directly for operation of programs on reservations", and

WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe is best able to provide and administer services for its own members,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin no longer desires Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council, Inc. admin- istration of H.E.W/O.N.A.P. programs and further requests direct funding from O.N.A.P. for ongoing and proposed programs.
