RESOLUTION NO. 5-15-91-C

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribal Council has delegated to the Oneida Business Committee authority to exercise the enumerated powers of the Oneida Constitution, Article IV as amended, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: PETERSON (H)

The Northwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 AND
The West 1/2 of the Northeast 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 18, Township 23 North, Range 19 East, containing 60 acres, more or less; AND ALSO All of Lot 7, less a tract of land in the South West corner deeded to School District No. 2 Town of Oneida and less 1 acre described in Vol. 216 of Deeds page 211, and less land described in Volume 613 of Records, page 523; AND ALSO all of Lot 8 and the West 15 acres of the South East 1/4 of the South West 1/4, all in Section 18, Township 23 North, Range 19 East. AND ALSO, containing 29 acres more or less. The East 1/2 of the North East 1/4 of the South West 1/4, less the East 5 acres thereof, and the East 25 acres of the South East 1/4 of the South West 1/4, less 1 acre in the South West corner thereof, being 8 rods North and South and 20 rods East and West all in Section 18, Township 23 North, Range 19 East, containing 39 acres of land more or less, according to Government Survey.

WHEREAS, The above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide economic growth for the Oneida Tribe, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

CERTIFICATION
