RESOLUTION NO. 6-28-79-C

- WHEREAS, the recommended Goals and Objectives of the Oneida Nation identify that creek-related concerns are of significance; and,
- WHEREAS, the grant year for the Oneida Coastal Management Program ends in mid-Summer, resulting in the termination of the Coastal Planning Aide, who is a registered Oneida Indian; and,
- WHEREAS, the Program provides tangible and intangible benefits to the Coastal Planning Aide; and,
- WHEREAS, alternative funding for the Coastal Planning Aide would free Coastal Management money for use in other areas of the Program; and,
- WHEREAS, the Coastal Planning Aide has been a valuable assistant in the Program, and through continued work experience and formal education will increase his potential in the Program and the Oneida Tribe.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Coastal Management Program be granted 638 funding to retain the position of Coastal Planning Aide and that such funding begin mid-June for the amount of \$2500.
