RESOLUTION # 7-1-88-13

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States; and,

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and,

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee is aware that the drought-emergency has created an extreme hardship in the case of certain tribal members.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee declares that a drought-emergency presently exists on the reservation; and,


that all members whose wells run dry shall be serviced by the Tribe free of charge; and,

that this resolution shall be effective June 1, 1988 and shall remain in effect until further notice; and

that all wells serviced shall be certified by the Oneida Tribal Well and Septic Department of the Oneida Tribe.
