RESOLUTION # 7-8-88-B

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe's Business Committee is charged with protecting the health and welfare of tribal members, and

WHEREAS, the Norbert Hill Center, housing the Oneida Tribal School contains quantities of friable asbestos, and


WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has the responsibility for removal of asbestos in Tribal Schools, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau has not fulfilled its obligation to the Oneida Tribe for the removal of asbestos in the Norbert Hill Center, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs provide the Oneida Business Committee with a written plan detailing asbestos abatement procedures for the Norbert Hill Center by October 1, 1988.
