Grant Application Resolution to the Department of Housing and Urban Development

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, it is a goal of the Oneida Community to revitalize the Old Oneida commercial area, and
- WHEREAS, the Old Oneida Restoration Project will lay the foundation in Old Oneida for tribal entrepreneurs and small business development on the Oneida Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, implementation of this project will increase the land base of the Oneida Reservation through property acquisition of strategic properties.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits a Community Development Block grant application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the purpose of property acquisition, historical research, archeological surveys, environmental assessments and developing design guidelines in the Old Oneida commercial area.
