## RESOLUTION # 7-29-92-B

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live; while maintaining and re-establishing the sovereign rights of the Oneida Nation, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe seeks to strengthen and promote economic self-sufficiency, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe recognizes the importance of infrastructure; and the importance of maintaining that infrastructure, for further economic growth, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has developed a maintenance and operation plan addressing maintenance, repair and replacement of items not covered by insurance and operating resources, and including those concerns such as roads, sanitary sewer and potable water facilities and
- WHEREAS, those operation and maintenance plans have been adopted by the Oneida Tribe by this resolution, and
- WHEREAS, with the publication of regulations in the Federal Register which authorizes the participation of Indian Tribes and Alaskan Natives in the Community Development Grant Program, funded by the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin desires to reflect community participation, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has a desire to participate in the Community Development Block Grant Program, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has obligated a sufficient amount to construct the Community Development Building and to construct the relating infrastructure of the Community Development Park should other funding sources not be available.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is committed to allocating funds amounting to not less than \$250,000 but of an amount sufficient to meet the needs of the maintenance of the infrastructure, on an annual basis from the funding source of the Utility Department and Building and Grounds Road Maintenance budgets for the maintenance of infrastructure.
