RESOLUTION # 8-16-85-B

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Public Service Corporation whose address is P.O. Box 19002, Green Bay, Wisconsin, is to make an application for right-of-way to the Great Lakes Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Ashland, Wisconsin, for the purpose of installing electric and gas service lines on the following described lands of the Oneida Indian Reservation in Brown County, Wisconsin:
- Said electric and gas service lines to be located in part of Government Lot 22 and in part of Government Lot 23, in Section 29, Township 24 North, Range 20 East, City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the applicant desires to place such electric and gas service lines for the purpose of providing utility services for health, security and safety in the Oneida Housing Project, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe desires to waive payment of damages under the Code of Federal Regulations.
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee, Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby grants to the Wisconsin Public Service Corporation the right-of-way requested, the location which is more particularly shown on the attached map as Exhibit "A", and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Chairman, Oneida Business Committee sign such documents as may be required in connection with granting the right-of-way.
