RESOLUTION NO. 8-19-92-F

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribal Council has delegated to the Oneida Business Committee authority to exercise the enumerated powers of the Oneida Constitution, Article IV as amended, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: **B. CORNELIUS PROPERTY.**

That part of the Southwest Eight (8) acres of that part of Claim 152 in Township Twenty-Three (23) North, Range Nineteen (19) East, in the Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, which lies North and West of the State Trunk Highway 54; commencing at the Northeast corner of the above described tract where said Northerly line intersects the Westerly Line of State Trunk Highway 54; thence westerly along said northerly line 255 feet; thence southerly at right angles 116 feet more or less to the northerly boundary of the property described in deed recorded in Volume 218 of deeds at page 314, Brown County, Wisconsin registry; thence easterly and parallel with the northerly line to the westerly line of State Trunk Highway 54; thence in a northeasterly direction along the westerly line of State Trunk Highway 54 to the place of beginning. Together with the easement for drainage purposes over and across that part of Indian Claim 152 lying west of said described parcel of land to Duck Creek as reserved in deed dated August 10, 1966 and recorded in Volume 755 records, page 569.


WHEREAS, The above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, Residential and Commercial and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
