Resolution # 08-26-98-A Oneida Nation School Grant Resolution

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation School Board is a duly elected body of the Oneida General Tribal Council to be responsible for the continued growth and development of the (K-12) Oneida Nation School System Program, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation School System currently receives grant funding from the Federal Government under P.L. 100-297, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Nation School System receive funds through the granting process, under P.L. 100-297 for school operations, School-wide Consolidated Reform Plan, 94-142, Operations & Maintenance, Minor Improvements and Repair, Facilities Improvement and Repair, Construction Projects under \$100,000, and Construction Projects over \$100,000 and all other education money the school is authorized to receive. This resolution shall remain in effect until rescinded.
