
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Thomas M. & Suzanne M. Delebreaux, 1327 Broccoin Way, Green Bay, WI. 54313, Tax Parcel # 6H-1794
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Lot Eleven (11), according to the recorded Plat of West Point Subdivision, said Plat being part of Government Lot Twenty-four (24), in the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$), Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Twenty-four (24) North, Range Twenty (20) East, in the Fourth Principle Meridian, in the City of Green Bay, West side of Fox River, Brown County, Wisconsin.
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

RESOLUTION # 8-28-96-E

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
