RESOLUTION # 9-2-88-B


- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Housing Authority Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, August 30, 1988 to adopt a resolution to clarify the Oneida Tribe's legal designation, and
- WHEREAS, this correction is necessary due to the Tribe having eliminated all reference to "INC" (Incorporated) in their legal designation, and
- WHEREAS, this was necessary to affirm and substantiate the Oneida Tribe's right to claim sovereignty, and
- WHEREAS, sovereignty is implicit to being recognized as a governing body.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Board of Commissioners of the Oneida Housing Authority acknowledge the correct legal designation of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that all reference to "INC" (Incorporation) be disregarded wherever shown in the Tribal Ordinance which established the Oneida Housing Authority and from all related documents and stationary made part thereof.
