RESOLUTION NO. 9-16-83-A

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee, being the duly authorized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee, in the interest of continuing to provide health care services to it's members and their families, and
- WHEREAS, The childhood diseases of polio, measles, mumps, rubella, diptheria, tetanus and pertussis still pose a threat to unimmunized children; the complications from these diseases are often devastating to both parents and their children; and
- WHEREAS, Vaccine which prevents these diseases have proven to be safe and effective, and have prevented needless costs and hardships to families and,
- WHEREAS, The number of children appropriately immunized among the Oneida Tribe is currently below the level adequate for prevention of disease, and
- WHEREAS, We believe that our children are our most precious resource and in our children lies the future of the Oneida Nation,
- WE THEREFORE RESOLVE: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians support and promote efforts of the Oneida Health Center to maintain an immunization level among the Oneida population appropriate to maintain immunity from disease and strongly encourages parents and all Tribal members to actively comply with recommendations for immunization of their children
