Grant Application for the Preservation and National viewing of the Oneida Historical Perspective

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain and build a solid educational foundation by addressing human needs of all members throughout the circle of life, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Communications Department will provide community education and learning opportunities for the Oneida Nation as well as to the general public assuring Seventh Generation Lifelong Learning, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family will be strengthened by promoting and educating the United States on the Oneida Historical Perspective of tribal government structure and its contributions to the U.S. Constitution for viewing by the general public as well as preserving this history in film format for the next seven generations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin/Communications Department in cooperation with the Native American Public Telecommunications -Public Television Program Fund authorizes and submits this grant application for the preservation and national viewing of the Oneida Historical Perspective.
