RESOLUTION # 9-21-94 CC

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Isaac J. and June Cornelius, both tribal members has made application for a long-term lease for residential purposes more particularly described as follows:

A parcel of land located within Claim 21, and being a part of the N 1/2 SW 1/4 Section 30, Township 23 North, Range 19 East, 4th P.M., Outagamie County, Wisconsin, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the point where Claim 21 intersects with the centerline of Johnson Road; thence northwesterly following the north line of Claim 21, a distance of 730 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence left to the perpendicular 45° northeasterly direction, a distance of 435 feet, more or less, to the north line of said Claim 21; thence right to the perpendicular 45° in a southeasterly, direction a distance of 200 feet, more or less, to the Point of Beginning, containing 2.0 acres, more or less, subject to all valid existing right-of-way of record.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by this Committee in Regular session assembled, hereby requests the Superintendent, Great Lakes Agency, to draft a lease in accordance with the Act of August 9, 1955 (69 Stat. 539), as amended, 25 USC 415, for the above described land with a 25-year term which shall automatically and without notice renew for an additional term of 25 years at a total rental of \$1.00 annually, or \$50.00 for fifty years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease documents for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

CERTIFICATION
