RESOLUTION # 9-21-94 L

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Ed Lemmen Property, 2847 W. Mason St., Green Bay, WI All of Lot 1, Volume 20, Certified Survey Maps, page 323, Brown County Records, and part of Lot 11, Section 30, T24N-R20E, City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin, more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the East 1/4 Corner, Section 30, T24N-R20E, thence N89°41'03"W, 824.00 feet along the north line of Lot 11, said Section 30, thence S0°36'07"W, 160.86 feet along the extension of the easterly right-of-way of Crestwood Drive, to the point of beginning, thence 18.74 feet along the southerly right-of-way of a frontage road, being the arc of a 12.00 foot radius curve to the right whose long chord bears N45°20'40"E, 16.89 feet, thence 128.30 feet along said right-of-way being the arc of a 325.00 radius curve to the left whose long chord bears N78°46'39"E, 127.47 feet, thence 115.19 feet along said right-of-way being the arc of a 325.00 foot radius curve to the right whose long chord bears N77°37'18"E, 114.59 feet, thence S0°52'00"W, 242.42 feet along the east line of Lot 1, Volume 20, Certified Survey Maps, page 323, Brown County Records, thence N89°37'48"W, 84.21 feet along the south line of said Lot 1, thence N0°36'07"E, 144.26 feet along the west line of said Lot 1, to the northeast corner of Lot 2, said certified survey map, thence N89°54'46"W, 163.00 feet to the east right-of-way of Crestwood Drive, thence N0°36'07"E, 36.11 feet along said right-of-way to the point of beginning.



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
