- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Vacant Land of William Van Boxtel Property.
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows: Part of the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 6, and part of the North 1/2 of the NE 1/4 of Section 7, T23N, R19E, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin which is more fully described as follows:

Beginning at the NE Corner of said Section 7; Thence S00°00'00"E, 177.59 feet along the East line of the NE 1/4 of said Section 7; Thence S79°11'47"W, 428.64 feet; Thence S56°00'16"W, 215.85 feet; Thence S00°00'00"E, 946.48 feet to a point on the South line of the North 1/2 of the NE 1/4 of said Section 7; Thence S89°20'56"W, 2035.60 feet along said South line to the SW Corner of said North 1/2; Thence N00°00'11"W, 1314.93 feet along the West line of said NE 1/4 to the North 1/4 Corner of said Section 7; Thence N89°16'33"E, 1317.88 feet along the North line of said NE 1/4 to the SW Corner of the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of said Section 6; Thence N00°19'21"W, 1323.55 feet along the West line of said SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 to the NW Corner of said SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4; Thence N89°25'16"E, 1339.50 feet along the North line of said SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 to the NE Corner of said SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4; Thence S00°37'00"W, 264.78 feet along the East line of said SE 1/4; Thence S88°35'14"W, 215.13 feet; Thence S00°37'00"W, 255.00 feet; Thence N88°35'14"E, 15.00 feet; Thence S00°37'00"W, 300.19 feet; Thence N88°35'14"E, 200.13 feet to a point on the East line of said SE 1/4; Thence S00°37'00"W, 500.51 feet along said East line to the point of beginning.

Said parcel contains 102.55 acres of land, more or less (101.65 less road) and is subject to all easements and restrictions of record, reserving that part presently being used for road purposes.

- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
