RESOLUTION # 10-06-95-B

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Senior Citizens Program was established to assist elders in maintaining an independent, healthy, productive and quality lifestyle through love, caring and respect by the services provided, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin recognize elders are vulnerable sector of the tribal population for which the Elder Abuse Program was established to provide support and advocacy for elders who may be victims of emotional, physical, or financial abuse;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin make application to the Bay Area Agency on Aging for an Elder Abuse Direct Services Grant to provide direct and preventative services to Oneida elders who are, or may be, victims of abuse..

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribal Chairwoman, or the Vice Chair, is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any amendments thereto.
