RESOLUTION NO. 10-15-76-C

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin is a party-plaintiff in the suit of Oneida Nation vs. Oneida and Madison Counties, now pending before the Federal District Court in New York, and

WHEREAS, the original Oneida Nation was fragmented geographically in the early 1800's, and


WHEREAS, there are now three distinct Oneida communities; the two others being in Ontario, Canada and Oneida, New York, and

WHEREAS, it is beneficial and desirable that each of the three Oneida communities legal interests in common lands be recognized by the others.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida's of Wisconsin by their duly elected officials recognize the legal interests of the Canadian and New York Oneidas in any and all litigation based upon claims to land located within the State of New York.
