
Wisconsin Department of Transportation Section 5311 FY 2001 Operating Assistance grant program

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin the Oneida Tribe has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has also determined that the health, safety, and welfare of the Oneida People is one of its top priorities, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has developed the Oneida Public Transit department to help our people and our community become self-sufficient by providing the accessibility to get to and from work, home, and other events by providing safe, affordable transportation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe apply for Section 5311 FY 2001 Operating Assistance from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation to assist in the efforts of providing for safe, affordable, and accessible transportation to the Oneida People and the Oneida Community.
