Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.



RESOLUTION # 11-5-85-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council to protect and preserve the sovereignty of the Oneida Tribe, its rights and its resources, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is the beneficial owner and proprietor of the lands embraced by this plat #1120, Three Sisters Subdivision, and
- WHEREAS, said Oneida Tribe has caused said lands to be surveyed, subdivided and mapped as shown thereon for the purpose of a planned residential development, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe desires to dedicate the streets depicted and shown thereon to the City of Green Bay, Wisconsin, for public use and public utility purposes
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that this subdivision, to be known as Three Sisters Subdivision, be and is hereby accepted and approved by the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and that the streets depicted and shown thereon are dedicated to the City of Green Bay, Wisconsin for public use and public utility purposes.
