RESOLUTION # 12-18-96-E

- WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Vanderperren Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Part of Government Lots 1 and 2, all of Government Lots 3, 4, 5, 6, and 8; all in Section 4, T24N, R19E, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin which is more fully described as follows:
Beginning at the NW Corner of said Section 4; thence N89°00'36"E, 1315.41 feet; thence S01°05'39"E, 355.06 feet; thence S88°34'53"E, 1296.59 feet; thence N01°45'01"W, 409.59 feet; thence N89°00'36"E, 24.75 feet; thence N89°07'22"E, 52.02 feet; thence S70°54'06"E, 191.53 feet; thence S01°45'01"E, 346.58 feet; thence S00°40'56"W, 107.88 feet; thence N88°34'53"W, 231.02 feet; thence S00°40'56"W, 1228.45 feet; thence N88°11'23"W, 2622.96 feet; thence N00°11'44"W, 1610.49 feet to the point of beginning.
- WHEREAS the above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
