### RESOLUTION NO.4-12-06-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:  
Former Van Boxtel Limited Partnership Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:  
Legal Description: See attached.  
Tax Parcel Numbers: 17-0-1487-00, 17-0-1484-05, 17-0-1486-00, 17-0-1484-06,  
17-0-1484-00, 17-0-1485-00, 17-0-1489-00, 17-0-1485-03
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential and agricultural land use, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

PARCEL ONE: Lots One (1), Two (2), Three (3) and Outlot One (1), Vol. 20 Certified Survey Maps, Page 3822, Map No. 3822, as Doc. No. 1375005; said map being part of Lot Two (2), Certified Survey Map No. 29 and part of Government Lots Seven (7) and Eight (8), all in Section Eight (8), Township Twenty-three (23) North, Range Nineteen (19) East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, in the Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.

PARCEL THREE: Government Lot Nine (9), lying North of Town Road located in Section Eight (8), Township Twenty-three (23) North, Range Nineteen (19) East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, in the Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin. Less and excepting the South 400 feet thereof.

PARCEL FOUR: Government Lot Ten (10), lying North of Town Road located in Section Eight (8), Township Twenty-three (23) North, Range Nineteen (19) East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, in the Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin. Less and excepting the South 200 feet of the East 400 feet and the South 400 feet of the West 125 feet thereof.

PARCEL FIVE Part of Government Lots 8, 9 and 10, Section Eight (8), Township Twenty-three (23) North, Range Nineteen (19) East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, described as follows:

Commencing at the Northeast corner of parcel 4, CSM recorded in Vol 1, page 93; thence North 70 feet to the North line of the Town Road; thence West 1,000 feet; thence North 200 feet which shall be the point of beginning; thence North 200 feet; Thence East 600 Feet; thence South 200 feet; thence West 600 feet to the point of beginning.
