- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:
Former Richard J. Giesler, William C. Bain, and Lewis H. Krueger, a/k/a Wintergreen II Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:
Legal Description: See attached.
Tax Parcel Numbers: 17-0-1502-00, 17-0-2165-00, 17-0-2172-00, 17-0-2174-00, 17-0-2177-00
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential and agricultural land use, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

Commencing at the East 1/4 corner of Section 16, Township 23 North, Range 19 East; Thence N89°12'39"W, 40.00' along the North line of the Northeast 1/4-Southeast 1/4, said section to the Westerly R/W of C.T.H. "U"/South County Line Road and the Point of beginning; thence S00°33'46"W, 225.00' along said R/W; thence 89°12'39"W, 743.06'; thence N00°33'46"E, 225.00' to the North Line of the Northeast 1/4-Southeast 1/4, said section; thence S89°12'39"E, 743.06' along said north line to the point of beginning.

Parcel I: Part of Indian Claims 115, 120 and 125; being part of Sections 4 & 9, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County and part of Sections 3 & 10, Town of Hobart, Brown County, all being in Township 23 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, State of Wisconsin, more fully described as follows:

Commencing at a southerly corner of Indian Claim 136, in Section 3, Township 23 North, Range 19 East of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Brown County, thence N65°31'53"W 51.30' along the Northerly line of Indian Claim 125 to the Westerly right of way of Freedom Road also known as County Trunk Highway "E" and the point of beginning; thence 321.59' along the arc of a 4708.17' radius curve to the left whose long chord bears S35°44'30"W 321.53' along said right of way; thence S33°44'30"W 998.89' along said right of way; thence N78°33'19"W 334.01'; thence S34°14'46"W 660.00'; thence N78°33' 19"W 256.79'; thence S33°44'30"W 394.29'; thence S78°33'19"E 597.08' to the westerly right of way of Freedom Road; thence S33°44'30"W 329.75' along said right of way; thence S38°52'40"W 100.32' along said right of way; thence N88°56'45"W 565.58' along the North line of Volume 8 Certified Survey Map 1491, Outagamie County records; thence S30°36'39"W 480.39' along the West line of said Certified Survey Map; thence S33°08'08"W 275.00' along the West line of Volume 11, Certified Survey Maps 2148, Outagamie County Records; thence S56°51'52"E 467.76' along the South line of said Certified Survey Map to the Westerly right of way of said Freedom Road; thence S33°08'49"W 260.64' along said right of way; thence N60°14'22"W, 1413.95' to a point being S60°14'22"E 570' more or less from the East edge of the Duck Creek River also being the start of a meander line; thence N43°00'35"E 4149.24' to the North line of Indian Claim 125, said point being S65°31'53"E 116' more or less from the East Edge of the Duck Creek River and the end of said meander line; thence S65°31'53"E 748.70' along the North line of said Indian Claim 125 to the point of beginning. Including all lands lying between the meander line and the East Edge of Duck Creek River.
