

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has determined its mission for the Oneida Community Health Center is to provide the highest level of quality, culturally sensitive, holistic and preventative healthcare, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe through the vision of the Oneida Community Health Center/Assisted Living/Anna John Nursing Home is to achieve the highest level of physical, mental, social, and spiritual health through an open door to a caring, integrated, culturally-sensitive healthcare system that addresses the needs of our elderly population, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe believes there is a need to continue to expand and improve the current available services for the Oneida Elders.
