
RESOLUTION # 2-13-02-A Oneida Community Education Center/Children's Trust Fund

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its Seven Generation Commitment, "To develop a provisional system that fits our "family"/community values such as food, shelter, clothing and education as well as other services," and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Community Education Center to promote quality educational and employment support opportunities for all members of the Tribe from early childhood through life, in accordance with Oneida's need for cultural survival and well-being, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family and Community will be strengthened by providing critically needed services that will have a positive impact on family and youth/health and healing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin/Community Education Center in collaboration with the State of Wisconsin/ Children's Trust Fund, authorizes and submits this grant application for the purpose of securing external monies to create a community-based family strengthening program that addresses the critical needs of teen and adult parents within our community.
