BC Resolution 01-25-12-A Establish Oneida Housing Authority (OHA) HUD income limits at Outagamie County income limits

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee acting as the tribally Designated Housing Entity can in accordance with NAHASDA Program Guidance NO. 2011-04, July 14, 2011, may set income limits for multi-county reservations at the income limit level of the county with the highest income limits.

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee and Tribally Designated Housing Entity approve the adoption of this resolution specifying the Income Limits under the Native American Housing and Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 be set at the Outagamie County Income Limits for all Oneida Housing Authority, NAHASDA funded housing programs.
