- WHEREAS, in accordance with the By-Laws, Section I 1.4, of the National Indian Gaming Association, Officers of N.I.G.A, Executive Committee members, and primary and alternate regional representatives must be designated representatives of a member tribe and must be an enrolled member of a tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a member in good standing of N.I.G.A. and Ernie Stevens Jr. is an enrolled member of the Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has selected Ernie Stevens Jr. as its designated representative to the National Indian Gaming Association, and
- WHEREAS, Ernie Stevens, Jr. has done outstanding work representing all Tribal sovereigns while fulfilling the responsibilities as Chairman of N.I.G.A. in pervious years, and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby endorses Ernie Stevens Jr.'s bid for re-election to the position of Chairman of N.1.G.A.
