Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

Resolution Designating representatives for the Wisconsin Tribal Conservation Advisory Council (WTCAC)

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section I of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Tribal Conservation Advisory Council (WTCAC) was established for the purpose of assisting American Indian Tribes with environmental issues, as is more fully set out in the WTCAC By-Laws, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Member Tribe of the Wisconsin Tribal Conservation Advisory Council; and

WHEREAS, WTCAC By-Laws require each Member Tribe to designate a delegate and alternatives;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin appoints Paul Ninham, Business Committee Council Member, as the delegate. The Environmental, Health and Safety Area Manager and Eco-Services Director will be the alternates to the Wisconsin Tribal Conservation Advisory Council.
