### RESOLUTION # 7-18-01-A

#### Oneida Tobacco Abuse Prevention Program/American Legacy Foundation

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its mission for the Oneida Tobacco Abuse Prevention Program to "protect and promote health, and prevent disease and injury", and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Tobacco Abuse Prevention Program would like to provide culturally sensitive, community based smoking cessation services for Oneida Community Members, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family and Community will be strengthened by providing critically needed services that will have a positive impact on family and youth strengthening, health and healing.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:** That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin/Oneida Tobacco Abuse Prevention Program in collaboration with the American Legacy Foundation, authorizes and submits this grant application for a critically needed culturally based community health Program that addresses the need to eliminate the risks tobacco abuse poses to the health and well-being of the Oneida People.
