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RESOLUTION # 11-03-04-B Amendment to DHHS/IHS FY 2005 Funding Agreement

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government, a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and a Self-Governance Tribe with the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Indian Affairs and with the Department of Health and Human Service's Indian Health Service; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, it is the mission of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin to protect and improve the resources, the standards of living, and the environment in which the Oneida people live while maintaining, enforcing, and exercising the sovereign rights of the Oneida Nation; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 2005 Self-Governance Funding Agreement between the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Indian Health Service provides that the Funding Agreement may be amended by mutual consent of the parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin consents to amend the FY 2005 Self-Governance Funding Agreement by adding the following language as Item 5 under Section 2 Tribal Programs and Services, Part D Facilities: "*Nursing facility services at the Anna John Nursing Home to the same extent that skilled nursing or nursing facility services are covered services under the Medicare or Medicaid program.*"
