
Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

RESOLUTION 11-10-10-C Emergency Management-Homeland Security Agency Deputation Agreement

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee believes it to be in the best interest of the Tribe and its members and to promote tribal sovereignty, to enter into government-to-government deputation agreements to provide comprehensive Emergency Management-Homeland Security services on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has determined that the philosophy regarding these activities is inherently a responsibility of the Oneida Business Committee to protect, safeguard, promote peace, safety, and general welfare for the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, a copy of the proposed agreement between Emergency Management-Homeland Security Agency (EMHS) and Office of Justice Service (OJS) is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as part of this resolution, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin seeks to enter into such agreement with the Department of Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Justice Services, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits into the attached Deputation Agreement between the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Law Enforcement Services, Office of Justice Services (OJS) and the Emergency Management-Homeland Security (EMHS) Agency from the Oneida

Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin. This agreement supports the **Tribal Law & Order Act of 2010** for federal state accountability, coordination, empowering Tribal justice systems, resources for Tribal justice programs, data collection and information sharing, to assist in EMHS Officers as Agents in enforcement & prevention programs related to Homeland Security.
