Update on financial report after the implementation of budget restraints:

1. Reduction of Inventory for enterprises has been cut but is due to the increase of sales.
2. Program advertising can be cut approximately 40% without causing any serious problems.
3. Gaming advertising plan has not been completed yet. Ideal plan is to consolidate the advertising of Gaming, retail and programs to coordinate and utilize all media as necessary.
4. Discussion on need to advertise the West Wind Center. It was recommended that the Communications Department do a feature story on the retail stores.
5. There were suggestions on construction of a truck stop on Highway 32-29 corner, improve; the parking for trucks at the 54 store.

Discussion on the state gas tax and the need to develop an ordinance/code and to negotiate with the state.

John Spangberg requested a report on the amount of gas pumped per month back to 1987, Bob Niemela will work on obtaining that report.

Lucky U is completed per the requirements of EPA.

Kathy Hughes asked for comments in regard to the budget restraints presently in effect.

Community Development has made the 10% cut and is in the process of revising their complete budget.


No Major projects are being affected by the restraints.
