ONEIDA GENERAL TRIBAL COUNCIL RESOLUTION GTC-4-30-84-B

- WHEREAS, The Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the responsibility to upgrade all existing ordinances of the Oneida Tribe; and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee has determined that the existing Election Ordinance is in need of revision; and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee has considered the proposed Election Ordinance; and,
- WHEREAS, The attached Election Ordinance has been approved by the Oneida Business Committee on April 16, 1984, at it's regular monthly evening meeting, open to all tribal members; and,
- WHEREAS, No less than two public hearings were held by the Oneida Business Committee, at which all tribal members were free to express their views and submit their comments on the proposed Election Ordinance.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the attached ordinance is hereby approved and adopted by the Oneida General Tribal Council to govern all elections of the Oneida Tribe; and,
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That upon adoption by the Oneida General Tribal Council the attached Election Ordinance and this Resolution shall be presented to the Secretary of the Interior for his information.
