


Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc.

ONEIDA GENERAL TRIBAL COUNCIL RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION NO. 8-9-80A

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee has acted on the recommendation of the Litigation Committee to seek dismissal of the case known as Oneida Nation v. United States, also known as Docket 301 now pending before the U.S. Court of Claims, and
- WHEREAS, the continued maintenance of Docket 301 is compromising other superior Oneida land claims now pending in the Federal District Court for New York, and
- WHEREAS, other Oneida people in Canada and New York are not parties, and cannot become proper parties in Docket 301, because of U.S. statutory law, 25 U.S.C. § 70a, and
- WHEREAS it is the determination of the Oneida people in Wisconsin that these other Oneida people have an interest in the subject of the proceedings in Docket 301 and such interest is a legal liability to any final judgement in proceeding, to which they are not parties.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the recommendations of the Oneida Litigation Committee and actions of the Oneida Business Committee in directing Marvin Chapman, Attorney of Record for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, to take immediate legally appropriate action to dismiss Docket 301, is hereby reinforced, endorsed and ratified by the Oneida General Tribal Council.
