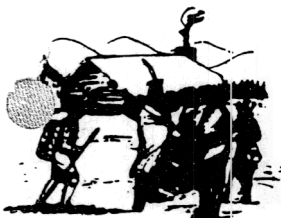

WHEREAS: The Oneida Housing Authority was established under Tribal Ordinance No. 1, April 20, 1963, to provide and promote better living conditions for all persons residing on the Oneida Reservation and,


WHEREAS: The Oneida Housing Authority has provided safe and sanitary housing for a number of Oneida residents at this time, and

WHEREAS: The Oneida Housing Authority is proceeding to convert project 10-3 rental units to mutual help due to the federal government cut backs on the number of HUD homes being made available to tribes and the number of tribal members seeking home ownership.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby supports and endorses the Oneida Housing Authority's proposal for conversion of the 10-3 rental project to mutual help home ownership program and agrees that the Oneida Housing Authority shall manage and implement this program as successfully as possible.
