## **RESOLUTION 03-09-11-B** **Comprehensive Anti-gang Strategies and Programs Grant** **U.S. Department of Justice** **Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention**

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin established the Oneida Police Department to "serve the Oneida Community and its members by helping to build a stronger, safer community by protecting and serving while instilling a sense of unity and treating all with respect and compassion", and

**WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin understands there is a need to work with community members to empower and give them a "buy-in" to want to prevent our at-risk youths from joining in gang activities and to quell gangs that are already established, and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:** that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits a Comprehensive Anti-Gang Strategies and Programs grant application to the U.S. Department of Justice/Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention for an amount up to \$250,000 and no match.
