BC Resolution 04-10-13-D Regarding Forgiveness of Jared Skenandore

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Pardon and Forgiveness Screening Committee reviewed the forgiveness application of Jared Skenandore at a duly called hearing held on March 14, 2013, and
- WHEREAS,** the requirements of the Pardon and Forgiveness Law have been fulfilled.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee by this resolution hereby:

Approves the forgiveness of Jared Skenandore for the act(s) of misdemeanor theft-PTAC, and notifies the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and its agencies that he shall have all the benefits and opportunities available to all other persons as if the activity forgiven by this resolution did not exist. Forgiveness has been approved based on the following:

1. List of reasons for approving the forgiveness application per 5.9-3.
 - Paid his fine
 - Committee felt he knew what he did was wrong

Denies the forgiveness of **Name**, and notifies **him/her** that **she/he** may request forgiveness after one (1) year from the date of certification of this document. Forgiveness has been denied based on the following:
