RESOLUTION # 4-20-05-A Host a VISTA Volunteer

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Social Services' Elderly Services Program is a vital component in ensuring the well being of the Tribe's elder citizens, and
- WHEREAS,** the National Society for American Indian Elderly has approved the Oneida Tribe's Elderly Services Program as a VISTA placement site, and volunteers provide the US economy with billions of dollars of savings annually and the Tribe's Elderly Services Program will receive a financial benefit and additional personnel through hosting a VISTA volunteer, and
- WHEREAS,** on April 14, 2005, a letter of intent in support of this resolution to host a VISTA volunteer was sent to the National Society for American Indian Elderly.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin desires to be a host site for a VISTA volunteer and the Oneida Business Committee authorizes the Elderly Services Director to be the designated representative to supervise the VISTA volunteer.
