- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, Wisconsin Representative Jim Soletski has served the 88th Assembly District since November 2006; and
- WHEREAS, Representative Soletski has demonstrated the highest standards of integrity, fairness, leadership, excellence, and dedication as an elected leader of the State of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS, Representative Soletski's dedication and commitment to his constituents within the Tribe exemplify the best of public service; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee does wish to recognize Representative Soletski's distinguished service to the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Oneida Business Committee does hereby express its sincere appreciation to Representative Jim Soletski on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, for his dedication, time, knowledge and diligence in making the Oneida Reservation a better place to live.
