### Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin 2014-2016 Transportation Improvement Plan

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (MAP 21) has provided funding to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the purpose of transportation improvements on the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin Reservation, and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby agrees with the needs and priorities presented in the 2014-2016 Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin Transportation Improvement Plan.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin supports and adopts the 2014-2016 Transportation Improvement Plan listed in the attached for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin fair share of the Tribal Transportation Program funding.
