BC Resolution 06-08-11-C *Adoption of the Social Media Policy*

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** a number of social media accounts are being administered by Tribal entities or on behalf of the Tribe with no regulation or oversight, which could lead to the abuse of these social media accounts and damage to the Tribe's reputation; and
- WHEREAS,** the Social Media Policy (Policy) was developed to enable the Tribe to oversee and regulate various types of social media accounts which are administered by Tribal entities or on behalf of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS,** the Policy sets standards related to the type of information that can be posted on a Tribal social media account and the responsibilities of administrators of those accounts; and
- WHEREAS,** the Policy creates a Website Steering Team to monitor Tribal social media accounts and to act as an advisory body to the Tribal Secretary's Office and to assist the Tribal Secretary's Office with administrating the Tribe's website and the Policy; and
- WHEREAS,** a public hearing was held on April 14, 2011, in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached Social Media Policy is hereby adopted.
