Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the Colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States was made possible.

Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

June 20, 1975

A special meeting of the Tribal Council was called to order by Chairman, Purcell Powless, at 11:00 a.m. The council members present were: Norbert Hill, Purcell Powless, Alma Webster, Gordon Mclester, and Wendell McLester.

1. Subject: Elderly Nutrition Project.

A proposal for the Elderly Nutrition was presented to the Council for approval or disapproval. Norbert Hill made <sup>the</sup> a motion for adoption of the proposal; seconded by Gordon McLester. Motion carried.

2. Subject: Part-time nurse for the Tribe on the health program.

Motion was made by Gordon McLester to hire a professional nurse on interim basis for 30 days, when deadline for the job description posted is ended. Seconded by Alma Webster: motion carried.

3. Subject: O.D.E.P.

Motion was made by Norbert Hill to select the following to be on a committee: Wendell McLester, Amelia Cornelius, 701 Planner and Percy Powless, including Norbert Hill to review the O.D.E.P. and submit to the printer. Seconded by Gordon McLester. Motion carried.

Motion by Norbert Hill to adjourn; seconded ny Alma Webster. Motion carried.
