Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States was made possible.


RESOLUTION # 07-01-97D Community Injury Prevention Grant

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe is committed to protecting the lives and preserving the quality of life for its membership, and
- WHEREAS, severe injuries are the leading cause of death for Indians ages to 44 years of age, and
- WHEREAS, the Bemidji Area has the highest injury death rate for to 4 year olds with a motor vehicle death rate that's 8 times the national average, and,
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe seeks to develop an injury surveillance system as part of its Community Injury Prevention Plan, in order to track injury rates and recommend appropriate intervention activities.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits an application to Indian Health Services for a Community Injury Prevention grant.
